A Message from our President / Executive Director


In 2017 Camp Beech Cliff will celebrate it's 20th anniversary! As I reflect with gratitude on our success, and the journey it took to get here, I can't help but think of this year's staff slogan, "Start Here, Go Anywhere." Intended to define the camp experience, it also defines our organizational history.

Our property, bordering Acadia National Park and Echo Lake, has a long history of campers. Originally a private boys adventure camp owned by the Pulis family, the property sat vacant until it was used by Harbor House for an after-school program in the mid-90's. Their leadership saw the extraordinary possibilities of reviving CBC as a summer day camp. In 1997 the property was purchased and CBC became an independent nonprofit. The rest is history!

Whether we're working with a camper or planning our future, it begins with assessing strengths. It has been clear from the start that the MDI community is committed to a shared vision of providing enriching outdoor programs to all. The CBC campus is a magical place that reflects the beauty and natural resources of Acadia. At a time when it is easier than ever for us to stare at a screen (and I include myself in this), I truly believe that it is more important than ever that our programs are rooted in nature and inspire young people to connect and engage with each other and our natural world.

While exploring the outdoors, we watch our campers experience self-exploration; many discover a new skill or passion; and most strengthen social, teambuilding and leadership skills. Also, at the heart of every camp experience are connections, most especially between campers and the counselors who mentor these young minds. We've seen how emphasizing a young person's personal assets can inspire positive change in him or her.

In the last few years, we have expanded programming year-round and most recently have added a focus on teens in the Acadia Teen Camps and year-round Acadia Leadership programs. 2016 Summer Camp



Establishing a Teen Camp CultureA Message from our Camp Director

This summer marked an exciting stage of growth for CBC – the summer camp and Acadia Leadership Institute worked together to launch Acadia Teen Camps. This initiative was made possible by a generous pledge from a camp family committed to providing meaningful opportunities for this age group. In the winter, we asked teens what they would enjoy doing at CBC and followed their lead. In addition to the long-standing Leaders-in-Training and Counselor-in-Training

programs, nineteen one-week themed teen camps were added to CBC's offerings.

The inaugural season received overwhelming positive feedback from the campers and their families who reflected on the benefits of challenge mixed with adventure and positive leadership. We found that Acadia Teen Camps allow campers to spend more time with their peers; to have more independence and responsibility; to participate in more off-site and overnight adventure excursions; and to have a voice in creating summer camp experiences that are meaningful to them.

One teen camper revealed to me that after completing two of the adventure teen camps, he stood taller, stronger, and more confident in his uniqueness. He told me, "I will do everything I can to come back next year. I want to be a counselor." It is one thing to hear this from a seven-year-old, as I often do, but for this 14-year-old to express his dream to be a counselor carries a lot of weight. It means our camp counselors are doing exactly what we hope – they are making camp fun while teaching all of our campers, even our teen campers, important life lessons.


I believe that our new Acadia Teen Camps provide young teens with the opportunities, experiences and tools to help them grow as positive and productive young adults. Whether they join the staff as a camp counselor or embark in new directions outside of camp, the impact is significant. Our investment in young teens serves not only them, but also our greater communities. As campers transition back to school, jobs, and social activities, they carry with them the tools gathered from camp experiences: creativity, problem solving, and teamwork. 




2016 Summer Camp Enrollment

Junior Maine Guide: One Woman's Journey

As a teen, Shelia Greene stared up at Katahdin's crest from the base of Knife's Edge. She trembled and her heart raced as she looked down at the plunging slopes and the jagged rocks fading into the fog below. One clumsy step could leave her tumbling down the mountainside. Fear echoed in her head, "I can't do this". Faced with the treacherous trail ahead, her self-doubt appeared in full force — but, ultimately, she rose above to meet the challenge.

50 years later, Shelia Greene recalls this moment as if it were yesterday. Hiking Katahdin was required for her certification as a Junior Maine Guide (JMG), an outdoor education curriculum that teaches young campers skills like canoeing, backcountry navigation, and building fires and shelters. With a map and compass in hand, Shelia learned to identify where she stood in the world, where she wanted to go, and how to get there. JMG also encouraged her to think about the map of her life beyond Maine's forests and mountains: where did she want to go, and who did she want to be?

Through the rigorous JMG curriculum, Shelia cultivated tenacity and self-assurance, qualities she has carried with her throughout adulthood. "Junior Maine Guide taught me that you don't give up, and you finish what you start," recounts Shelia. "That has stayed with me." When faced with personal challenges later in life, those qualities gave her the resilience she needed to continue moving forward. "I'm not sure that I would have made it through if I didn't have a strong sense of self, or a sense that you don't give up on yourself or others. . . those things were important to me. They still are."

As an active Camp Beech Cliff volunteer and donor, Shelia helps provide today's campers with the profound experience she had as a Junior Maine Guide. She is especially pleased that CBC offers seven weeks of JMG programs as part of its specialty camp series. She wants campers to use the skills they have learned, and the confidence they gained, to propel them forward when faced with their own challenges and be able to say, "I can do this!"

Youth NEW Program! Leadership Hancock County

Starting in 2017, Youth Leadership Hancock County (YLHC) will provide up to twenty Hancock County high school juniors leadership training and job coaching throughout the spring semester. Camp Director, Sylvie Piquet, modeled YLHC after the Ellsworth **Chamber's Leadership Hancock County** program. YLHC has two primary criteria for selecting participants: 1) the students have untapped leadership potential; 2) the students will likely remain in the county after graduation. Facilitated by CBC's Acadia Leadership Institute instructors, the cohort will meet once a month at a different host business or organization in Hancock County, Jackson Laboratory, Penobscot East Resource Center in Stonington, Ellsworth Police Department, and the **Town of Bucksport Heart & Soul Project** have signed on as partners to offer instruction. Each session will focus on developing the students' leadership skills through hands-on activities and growing an active peer leadership network. Students will meet with business leaders and gain awareness of the opportunities and issues that face our region, and the economic

Tools for Success A Message from our ALI Director

This summer I had the privilege to work hand-in-hand with our Acadia Teen campers. It was a summer filled with rewarding, teachable moments and wide smiles

as we traveled from adventure to adventure, ACADIA taking in the wonders of downeast Maine.

I am thrilled to continue our work with teen students and their educators this fall. School buses from Blue Hill,

Hancock, Dedham, MDI & elsewhere have been bringing teens to participate in our leadership programs. One program in particular has been extremely rewarding. In 2015, MDI High School launched Island Pathways as part of the Eastern Maine Skipper's program to provide students project-based learning outside of the classroom. As part of this program, CBC's Acadia Leadership Institute was asked to lead eight teambuilding and adventure learning sessions to strengthen interpersonal relationships through a progression of cooperative, hands-on challenges. The outdoor education curriculum was so well received, Island Pathways doubled their 2016-2017 program hours at CBC. I have built a working agreement with the fifteen 9th and 10th grade students to carry them through a year of teambuilding initiatives and outdoor learning with programs including orienteering, dog sledding, and sea kayaking. CBC is grateful to the Sumner Scholarship Endowment Foundation for funding this year's Island Pathways sessions with Acadia Leadership Institute!

Benefits of CBC at Camp and Beyond

For some of CBC's staff, the journey toward becoming a counselor starts at an early age. Take for example, Spencer Phillips from Bucksport, Aaron Miller from Bass Harbor, and summer resident Zach Schmidt from Southwest Harbor who each came to CBC as campers at age 8. Though the boys came from different backgrounds, a strong friendship developed. The three best friends returned to CBC each summer and dreamed of becoming counselors. "Not being a counselor didn't really **seem like it was an option,"** recalls Zach. "It was the natural thing to do — to keep going to camp." By age 15, they became counselorsin-training and then at age 16 their dreams came true; they were all hired as junior counselors.

The Camp Director, Sylvie Piquet, was a challenge course counselor when the three boys first came to camp. Her earliest memories of Aaron are that he was pretty wild, and struggled to control his body and behavior. When she learned that he wanted to be a counselor, she saw this as an opportunity to work together and define the behaviors necessary to achieve his goal. "We can both look back on that period now and have the priceless perspective to see what a difference structure and support can make." Each summer when staff are working with a challenging camper, she recounts this story and says, "Look at Aaron now!

Over time, Spencer, Aaron and Zach pushed each other to grow into mature leaders and have spent the past three summers as enthusiastic and adored camp staff. They bring the same philosophy to their work

For so many young people, Camp Beech Cliff enriches their lives — both at camp
