There's nothing like a pandemic to really shake things to the core. As a mother of daughters in middle school, high school, and college, I was in the thick of it with everyone else. I was worried for our families and children everywhere. And I was worried for Camp Beech Cliff because we could not open last year and really did not know until the spring months if camp would happen in 2021.

Remember that Joni Mitchell song Big
Yellow Taxi: "Don't it always seem to go /
That you don't know what you've got 'til it's
gone"? Our paradise was put on hold for
a while (and it certainly wasn't paved!)
but we could not return until assured
that campers and staff were going to
be safe. This was very worrisome for me
and quite difficult as we thought about
changing the camp operations; however, it
was worth it as you will read in the remarks
of Matt, our Camp Director.

The joy that I saw this summer from campers said it all. In fact, it was unlike anything that I've known in the past from parents, campers, and staff! With a reduced camper capacity, masks, new schedules and program models, new staffing structure, and the loss of large group gatherings and camp-wide singing, it wasn't what we'd normally think of as a perfect summer. But it was the summer we needed, and 661 campers and 45 staff had a true CBC experience of outdoor fun and togetherness.



In the Spring a teacher at Pemetic Elementary School in Southwest Harbor told me, "At least four times a week, I get asked: 'When can we go back to CBC?"

I think about all of you who helped us to accomplish this by supporting CBC in different ways through your gifts, volunteerism, words of encouragement; your involvement enabled us to stay open and plan, allowing CBC to move forward with creative ideas and new programs, such as an afterschool outdoor club on early release days and on-line programs.

In 2022, all of us will have reason to celebrate again as we commemorate our 25th anniversary! It's remarkable how we have grown during the past 25 years since being incorporated as an independent, non-profit camp. I am also excited about where we are heading in the next 25 years. Stay tuned: We look forward to announcing 25 ways to celebrate next year. Plan to celebrate with us!

The Kids are Alright!

Reflecting on a summer shaped by a global pandemic is challenging when I am writing while said pandemic is still actively impacting the community around me. However, these reflections are still driven by the knowledge and evidence that this past summer was one of the most important in recent history for our campers, our staff, and our families. What is the story that can

fully capture that experience for all of you? The beautiful truth is that, when looking back over the summer, there is not just one story that can serve to adequately illustrate the impact that this summer had on those who have found a place of comfort, safety, and acceptance in CBC. That impact can perhaps best be seen by exploring what was lost "As and what was reclaimed."

For many families, one of the silver linings of the pandemic was unexpected time together. We live in a perpetually busy culture that moves from one commitment to the next and this can leave little time to be together. As wonderful as those moments of shared experience were during the pandemic, it is equally important to have independent exploration.



Essential in youth development, children need time to explore the things that intrigue or excite them as individuals. Camp does this for a lot of children. This summer allowed children, and even their parents, to rekindle the true joy of discovering new aspects of who we are and want to be.

Our youngest campers,

the Starbursts, come to us on the cusp of big shifts in their lives. About half of them are just about to start school for the very first time, while the other half have just finished their first year of a real school experience. The pandemic halted that transition into school for so many. Even

classes virtually, this hiccup was occurring at a crucial developmental time.

This meant that camp was serving as more of a bridge for these students. I heard from multiple parents that they were grateful for their children's time at camp as it ensured that they would be entering the classroom this fall having regained some of the important social skills they would need in the coming school year.

Our staff included people who had not had a formal graduation ceremony in 2020, who spent their first year of college in virtual classes, or who had simply been disconnected in one way or another. Community was re-discovered

and the excitement and camaraderie were evident in the culture we welcomed our campers into as well.







Why does Camp Beech Cliff ask for donations?

Donations from individuals like yourself make up one-third of Camp Beech Cliff's income. This is by design. Camp Beech Cliff was founded as a resource for local families with the expressed goal of keeping camp fees as affordable as possible. Each donation received offsets a tuition increase or allows us to maintain a camp program.





What kind of grants does CBC receive?

Grants are written to offset fixed costs for summer camp like transportation, camperships and certain program expenses. Grants are also obtained to pilot programs as we expand Camp Beech Cliff's outreach. This summer a very generous grant allowed us to provide a steep weekly discount to assist Hancock County families impacted by the 2020 covid-driven economic downturn.


